BROADWAY

At the heart of the Cotswolds lies the quaint, picture-postcard village of Broadway. Peacefully dwelling at the base of the Worcestershire hills in a region of England that is nationally recognised as an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, Broadway is a beautiful and historic village ideal for those who love picturesque landscapes, excellent cuisine, and rich cultural heritage.

The image of Broadway today remains as it has done for centuries; a charismatic spectacle of rolling wolds, overlooking a gathering of ancient honey coloured limestone period buildings with orderly horse chestnut trees lining the grass-fringed verges of the historic 'broad way' High Street.

Highly regarded as a popular tourist destination in the UK Broadway attracts thousands of people every year from all over the globe. Due to its geographical accessibility, it also serves as the perfect starting point and gateway to explore the Cotswolds.

MALVERN HILLS

The Malvern Hills, which divide the beautiful English countryside of Herefordshire and Worcestershire, are a great destination for walkers of all ages and abilities, whether you are interested in a gentle stroll along a tree-lined path or an energetic trek along the ridge of the Malvern Hills. The unspoiled Teme Valley offers a great range of walking in glorious countryside and the Severn valley has striking riverside walks with views of the Cotswolds beyond.

WARWICK CASTLE

Dazzling shows and attractions, heaps of gruesome history and awesome birds of prey, all set within 64 acres of beautiful grounds and gardens make Warwick Castle a fun, action-packed day out for everyone. Open 364 days a year, Warwick Castle is ideally located in the heart of the country.

It's 1455 and the House of Lancaster holds the English Throne. King Henry VI's crown is challenged by the House of York. The rival houses clash in battle and the bloody war that ensues was to last over 30 years. Are you brave enough to enter the Castle Dungeon? This exciting 50 minute walk through brings together live actors, shows and spectacular special effects that will send chills down your spine (over 10's only – it's that scary!)

WELFORD-ON-AVON GOLF COURSE

Welford-on-Avon golf course is a pay & play family run hidden gem. Designed by Martin Hawtree in 2001 it's a stunning 18 hole par 70 (6080 yard) parkland course, with numerous water features and stunning views. What it lacks in facilities it makes up for in affability, variation and value for money. The course also stands out because of the sheer contrast between two nines. The front nine utilises the undulating land and the greens are well manicured. The back nine is longer and flatter, but water features come into play, and the 18th hole features an approach not dissimilar to the 17th at Sawgrass. It is a "superb family run course" with "excellent fairways and greens and a great layout."
